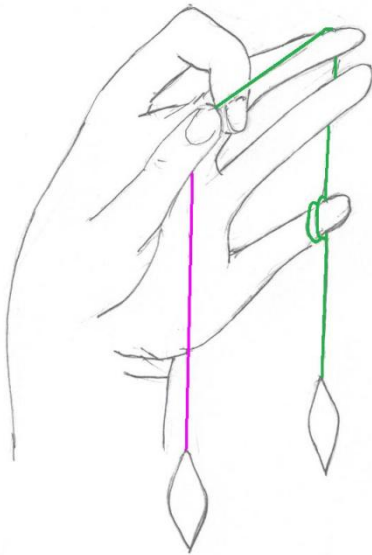
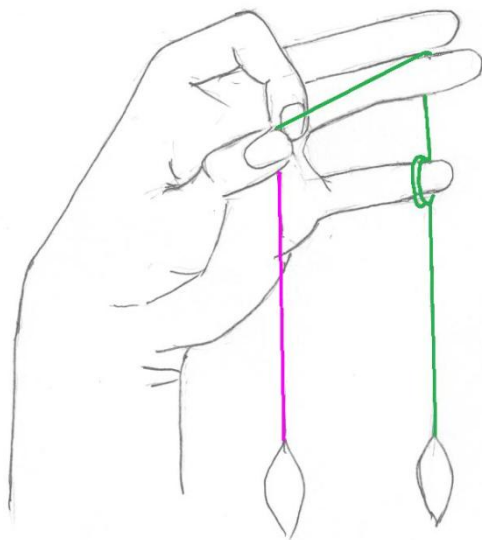


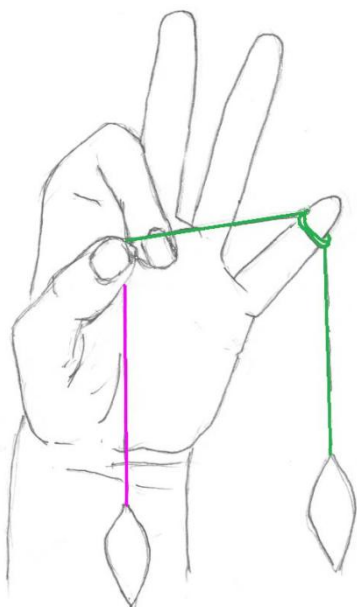
Ways of fixing the core thread during wrapping



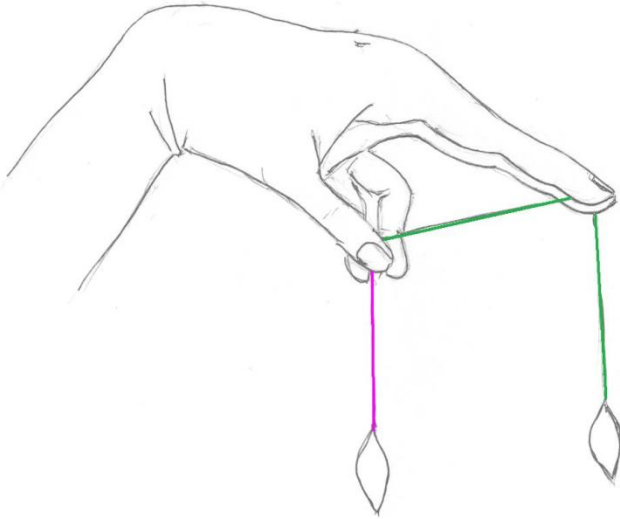
1. Holding shuttles as in ordinary 2-shuttle tatting, but the position of the fingers is compact enough, so the part of the core thread between the point and the middle fingers is rather short.



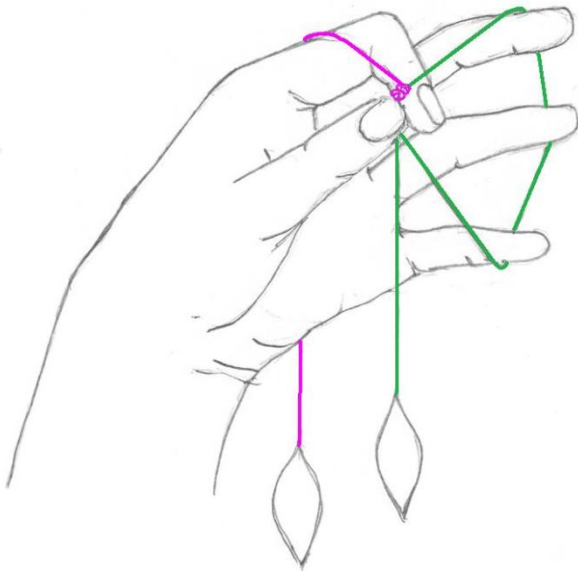
2. The core thread is fixed with the middle and ring finger. It is possible not to wind thread round the smallest finger.



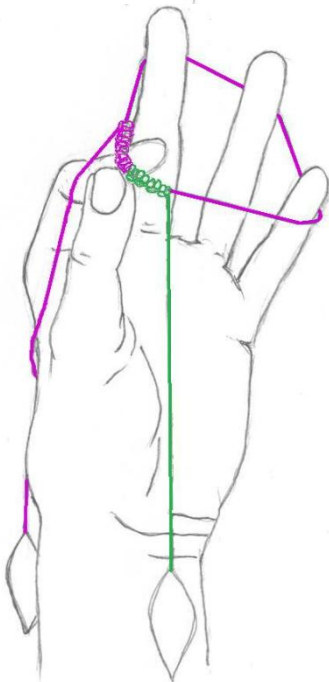
3. You may wind the core thread round the smallest finger or fix it between the ring and the smallest finger (for example if you want to hide rather short thread ends under the stitches).



4. This way of holding the core thread was suggested by Georgia Seitz for encapsulation.



5. This way of fixing the core thread is convenient for making daisy picot.



6. Jane Eborall calls this position of the fingers "position of dead spider", it is for making the 2nd half of split ring using wrapping.
